

ENGLISH GRADE SIX: WORD CLASSES

NOUN- Refers to the name of a person, place, thing or idea. Example: Daniel, London, Table, Hope.

“Mary uses a blue pen for her notes.”

ADJECTIVES- These are words that describe modify or give more information about a noun or pronoun

Examples: cold, happy, young, two, fun. **“The little girl has a pink hat”**

ADVERB- It modifies a verb, an adjective, or another adverb. It tells how (often), where and when.

Example: slowly, very, always, well, too

Yesterday I ate my lunch quickly.

CONJUNCTION-

-They join two words, ideas, phrases together and show how they are connected

Examples: and, or, but, because, yet, so

“I was hungry and tired but I still finished the job.”

PRONOUN -A pronoun is used in place of a noun or noun phrase to avoid repetition

Example: I, you, it, we, us, them, those

“I want her to dance with me.”

VERB

Show an action or state of being.

Example: go, speak, eat, live, are, is

I listen to the word then repeat it.

PREPOSITON

Shows the relationship of a noun or pronoun to another word. Example: at, on, in, from, with, about

“I left my keys on the table for you.”

Interjections

A word or phrase that expresses a strong emotion. It is a short exclamation.

Example: ouch!, hey! Oh!

“Wow! I passed my English exam”
